The surrounding neighborhood is a special place for Otto and Jessica, as their new home will be very close to Jessica's work and Otto's school, and their church is only a short distance away. The Smiths plan to host family game nights, church gatherings, and holiday get-togethers once the home is complete. "There will be many memories made here," Jessica says.

Jessica and Otto look forward to simple memories, from family meals to individual spaces, in their new home. "I am so excited to have a kitchen to call our own to cook and eat meals together," says Jessica.



"They have done a lot for us," says Otto. "Every day it seems like there is a new spark of hope for us. It brings us so much joy to see the community coming together to build our home."


Audited Financials 2020-2021 Revenue
